Eligibility: All Senior Thesis Writers in Harvard College
Application deadline: Friday, April 7, 2017

This prize was established in 1987 by Kathryn Huggins's brother, the late Professor Nathan I. Huggins, W. E. B. Du Bois Professor of History and of Afro-American Studies, to remember Kathryn by bringing attention to the values she held most dear: personal commitment and dedication to study, humanism through the study of other peoples and cultures, and respect for the marginalized and dispossessed. A prize of up to one thousand dollars is awarded for one or more outstanding senior theses from any department on a topic relating to African American life, history, or culture.

All African and African American Studies concentrators are automatically eligible for this prize and do not need to submit additional copies of their theses for consideration.

All other seniors must submit the application form, a copy of the thesis, a letter of recommendation from their thesis advisor, thesis reader comments, a one-page abstract of the thesis and a C.V. to our AAAS Graduate and Undergraduate Program Officer, Barker Center, Room 232.
